Course Description

The Advanced Nurse Lactation Consultant Certificate Program is an interactive continuing education program designed to provide qualified practitioners with the knowledge and skills essential to the development and implementation of management strategies for difficult or complex problems related to breastfeeding and human lactation in an appropriate psycho-social and cultural context. The program consists of a five day workshop with homework assignments, quizzes, competency verification and an examination. Learners interact with faculty who are clinical practitioners and expert in the area of Lactation Consulting and breastfeeding management.

Also considered and practiced in the course are counseling skills and related competencies. This course is offered in a face-to-face format multiple times a year in diverse locations.

Class begins at 8:15 and ends at 4:30 for the first four days. Lunch is one hour, 12-1 and there will be a break in the morning and the afternoon as directed by the faculty. On the fifth day, the class ends at noon. Please be prompt in returning to the teaching room after the breaks and lunch.

There are homework assignments on Monday through Thursday. Please have your assignment ready to turn in the next morning.

The credential is valid for 3 years and may be renewed via submission of proof of 18 hours of continuing education in breastfeeding and human lactation.

Knowledge and Skills of the Advanced Nurse Lactation Consultant/ Advanced Lactation Consultant:

Upon completion of the lactation management course, the participant should demonstrate competence in the specific categories described below:

A. Knowledge of breastfeeding and human lactation management as demonstrated by prerequisite criteria:

CLC certificate indicating successful completion of the Certified Lactation Counselor Training Program offered by the Healthy Children Project

Or

IBCLC Certificate from IBLCE indicating that he/she has passed the IBLCE exam

B. Current licensure as a Registered Nurse or Certificate of Completion from the course *Maternal and Infant Assessment for Breastfeeding and Human Lactation*

C. Application of the Lactation Consultation Process in the development of lactation management strategies and care plans in the clinical setting.

D. Integration of a variety of psychosocial approaches lactation consulting in the clinical setting.

Syllabus

Learners attend a 5 consecutive day lactation counselor course offered by the Healthy Children Project class with no absences (missed time may be made up in another course offering without penalty), participate in classroom exercises, competency verification exercises and problem solving discussions. The classroom experience includes large and small group interactions with faculty and other participants as well as interactions related to individual questions and issues.

Study guides with reflective questions will be distributed at the end of each day and along with other homework, will be due the next morning. There will be additional readings as well.

The textbook for the course is *Case Studies in Breastfeeding: Problem Solving Skills and Strategies* by Karin Cadwell and Cindy Turner-Maffei.
